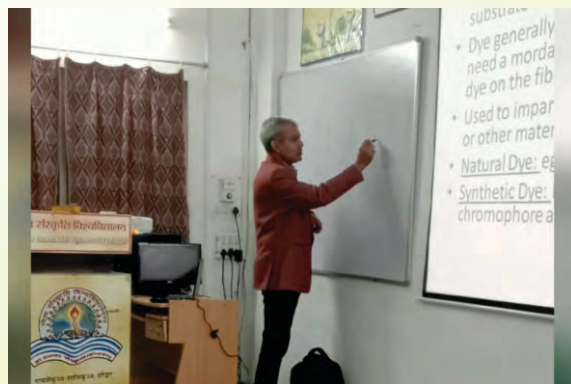

in the Environment Department

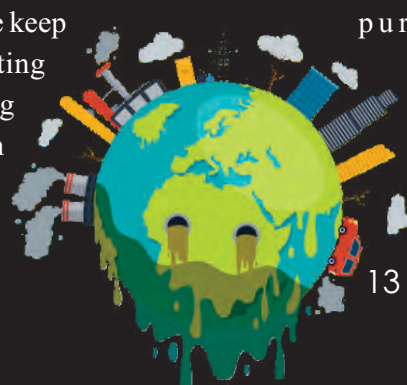

NATIONAL POLLUTION CONTROL DAY

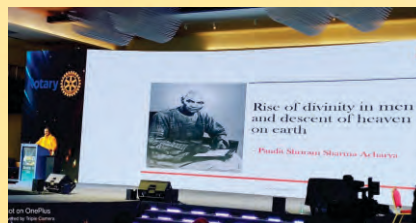

Will H. Cantrell, Associate Dean of Michigan Tech University, arrived at the university. On his arrival, he met the Respected Pro Vice-Chancellor, Dr. Chinmay Pandya. The fast pace of machines and their intensive use are harming our earth. Data centers emit carbon in a subtle way, but in a big way. Such data centers usually operate in the quiet environment of buildings located away from our eyes. In our struggle against the social harms of the AI system, it is necessary to include concerns related to the earth and the environment. In a similar conversation, topics such as how AI applications help solve challenges in Earth and atmospheric science, and sustainable development without a zero carbon footprint were discussed at the meeting. Solar panels have been installed on major buildings of the Dev Sanskriti Vishwavidyalaya campus, which generate some percentage of the electricity consumption in the university campus itself and are soon moving towards a Zero Carbon Footprint. Many students and researchers have done the research and work on the dimensions of AI and technology in the university. This center is inspired by the Research and Development Department of the Defense Research and Development Organisation.

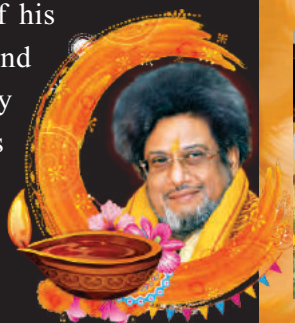
